Tipperary Arts Office, with support from the Arts Council, puts out a call each year to professional artists based in Tipperary to propose projects or events targeted at older people. In 2024, these events include one off performances and exhibitions as well as longer-term engagement projects based in community and care settings, which will culminate in a showcase during the month of May.

The Libraries run an extensive programme of activities across all branches. We are delighted to have the support of Tipperary ETB who are providing some workshops in all our branches throughout May. We also acknowledge the ongoing support of Tipperary Age Friendly, Creative Ireland and Healthy Ireland without which we could not provide access to so many free events.

The theme for Bealtaine 2024 – 2026 is Lust for Life, based on Iggy Pop's iconic punk-era song celebrating life's dreams, ambitions, intoxications and excesses. We hope you will join in and attend some events, embracing your own Lust for Life this year!

CARRICK-ON SUIR

It's Now or Never

**Setting: Ormond Dance Hall,
Carrick-on Suir, 1960s**

Four young people enjoy a night out: two sisters, one a town telephone operator, who knows everyone's business, the other a bold fearless young woman in defiance of authority; the fellas, a 'Flash Harry' type just back home from England, full of bravado stories of his adventures across the Irish Sea; the other, an only son of a farmer who is withered with rural life and yearns for change. The next bus to the ferry to England is at 8am. Who will be on it?

This original short drama is inspired by recorded conversations, later transcribed, with 20 older adults in three care home settings in Carrick-on-Suir, who generously shared stories of a time when they were young, free, and single in the late 1950s/60s.

This project has multiple outputs: live, private performances in the Care Home settings so the storytellers can witness a performance for which they provided the source material; a public performance in the Library; an 'uncut' online audio version performed by the drama writers.

Irish Gothic

Patricia Hurl

Tipperary Arts Office has partnered with the Irish Museum of Modern Art (IMMA), South Tipperary Arts Centre (STAC), Clonmel and the Source Arts Centre, Thurles, to bring *Irish Gothic*, by Tipperary-based artist Patricia Hurl to Tipperary. Irish Gothic presents the work of one of Ireland's most accomplished artists. The exhibition is selected from a major retrospective hosted by IMMA last spring and reconfigured as two separate shows in Clonmel and Thurles during May and June. Curated by Johanne Mullan, Curator: Collections, IMMA, the STAC show will feature some of Hurl's earlier pieces and works based on the female body, while the Source show will include later works and pieces from Hurl's Warrior series.

Taking place in the Source Arts Centre, Thurles on **Tuesday 11th June** this stimulating and fascinating event will see the two highly regarded Tipperary-based artists exploring a range of topics that have informed and inspired each of their practices.

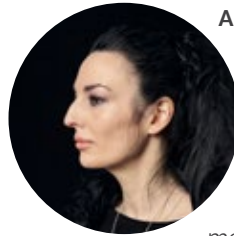


Patricia Hurl's work is by its nature political, and traverses the disciplines of painting, multi-media and collaborative art practice. Since the

1970s, she has created work that deals with loss, pain, frustration and loneliness. Originally from Dublin and a former member of Temple Bar Galleries and Studios, Patricia Hurl often works in collaboration with artist Therry Rudin with whom she co-founded Roscrea's Damer Gallery in 2012. Hurl was a lecturer in Fine Art Painting at the former Dublin Institute of Technology and studied at NCAD and Dun Laoghaire School of Art and Design.

Hurl has exhibited widely in selected group and solo shows including *Who Will Write The History Of Tears?*, Museum of Modern Art Warsaw, 2022; *The Narrow Gate of the Here and Now: IMMA 30 Years of the Global Contemporary: Queer Embodiment*; IMMA 2021 – 2022.

Hurl has represented Ireland in symposiums in the US, Australia and Spain. Hurl's work is represented in private and public collections including IMMA; The Arts Council; the Highlanes Gallery and the Collection of University of Limerick. She was awarded the Pollock Krasner Artist award, 2023.



Aideen Barry is a practising Visual Artist based in Ireland but with international representation. In 2020 she was elected to the RHA. She is a member of Aosdána and

lectures in several universities and schools of visual art in Ireland, the US and Europe. Barry is an artist whose work encompasses a vast range of disciplines and subjects, such as domestic labour, environmental fracture, and human vulnerability. Her work meditates on feminism, classism, intersectionality, and inequality. Utilising archives, museums, and other dialectic processes, she seeks to transfer the unknown through the experiential; democratising access to visual culture and complex ideas of otherness through clever ploys of collaboration and plot devices that seduce the viewer into her multi spatial experiences. Her works reflect her commitment to confronting unsettling truths and addressing gaps in the canon.

Message to Your Younger Self

February to Friday 10th May

Throughout the months of February and March, the Write Minds: Poetry & Wellness group invited members of the public to take part in the creation of a communal list poem, *Message to Your Younger Self*. Eileen Acheson and Jenny Cox also facilitated a poetry writing workshop in March inviting members of the over 50s community to create and share their own words for inclusion in the poem.

From gathered words of wisdom, love, warning and inspiration, Eileen and Jenny worked on the curation of a unique piece of poetry which was transformed into a written artwork by Clonmel artist, Deirdre Delamere. This bespoke artwork will be unveiled at a dedicated Spoken Word event when the poem will be read in full and local writers of all ages will share their own responses. The artwork will remain on public display until the end of May.

The aim of this project is to engage people of all ages to share their own insights and to reflect on those of others. What would you say to your younger self? The final poem hopes to serve as a reminder that with age comes opportunity.

A second venture of The Retracing Project engages active retirees and older community members in a project of social sharing, creativity and intergenerational engagement through baking and painting.

Burncourt is renowned for its community spirit to include its care of and support for its older citizens. What is often uncelebrated is the contribution older citizens make to the community events across the local social calendar. Whether for a funeral tea (offered to all local bereaved families), the bi-annual Big Breakfast, the Holy Communion party, or other community events, a cohort of older men and women spend hours creating baked goods to be delivered to the community hall. This project is a celebration of their contribution to the community and will include a recipe sharing morning, a watercolour workshop and community baking classroom. There will be lots of tea, cake, chats and creative learning!

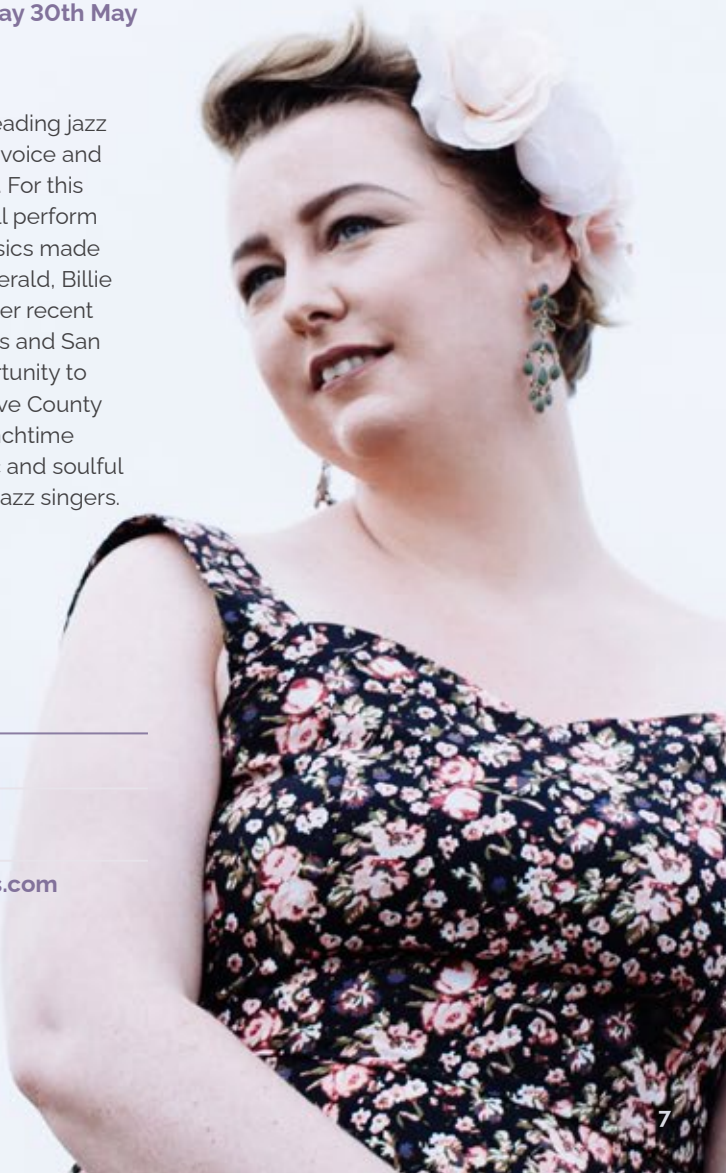

The Yesteryear Project

February to Wednesday 29th May

Did you ever throw stones on the tin roof of the village forge, then run before you were caught? Or remember an old bed bound uncle who shot a crow from the comfort of his bed? Or recall a very thin neighbour in a very big hat? These are just a few of the childhood memories we are collecting... people's stories.

Take small individual memories, but talk about them in a social group and they lead to bigger memories of our local places, our history and our heritage; places and times so changed or just gone.

The Old School Social Group are workshop participants and co-creators of the Yesteryear Project with visual artist Katy Goodhue. The group members are recording these memories, and then exploring and celebrating them using collage and text.

The project will be showcased during the last two weeks of May. An exhibition and celebration of the project will be held in the Old School, The Commons for the local community in late May. Inspired by the closing lines of Mary Oliver's poem *The Summer Day*: 'Tell me, what is it you plan to do with your one wild and precious life?' artists and poet Jo Slade, Gerry Carew and Patricia Leahy have invited members of the community to explore what it is to pay attention to their creative selves.

For many people the opportunity to explore creativity gets overlooked or is at best sporadic. Yet as we age we may feel an urgency to be creative and it may dawn on us that the need to explore our identity and expression through creativity can no longer be put on the long finger.

Participants in the project are provided with regular uninterrupted studio space and time throughout May. Workshops include demonstrations, discussions and engagement with a variety of art materials, mediums and techniques from watercolour, to acrylic to inks. The use of yoga, meditation and words add another layer to the creation of individual images.

Jo Slade is a poet and painter. Author of six collections and two chapbooks of poetry. Joint winner, Michael Hartnett Poetry Prize 2014. Forthcoming poetry collection 2024.

Gerry Carew has worked as an art therapist and visual artist for over forty years. She has exhibited in solo and group exhibitions and inspiration for much of her work comes from a strong connection to place, be it interiors or landscape. **Patricia Leahy Corcoran** holds an NCAD Fine Art Degree and an MA in Art Therapy. Patricia is dedicated to meditation and arts in health practices. **Paula Hynes** is a yoga teacher living in Tipperary. Her interests include creative writing, art and encouraging everyone to be comfortable in their own skin.
